The results of these surveys helped us design the Community Based Assessment that you will find in this document.

The Community Based Assessment was designed to evaluate ourselves based upon what our community values, rather than what legislators in Austin and Washington value. The concept of local control has long been lost in education and we want to take it back. We believe our students are worth more than just a test score. Our Community Based Assessments allowed our communities to provide input on how TISD is educating the whole child, not just the academic component of a child.

2017 is our baseline year and what you will find in the following pages provides an abundance of information about Texarkana ISD and who we are. In the coming years we will continue to monitor and evaluate our district and, as always, ask our community to provide feedback on how we are progressing in these areas.




